THE EVALUATION FRAMEWORK

APPROACH TO EVALUATION

Problem-Driven Iterative Adaptation (PDIA)

- ▶ Focuses on solving locally nominated and defined problems in performance (as opposed to transplanting preconceived and packaged “best practice” solutions)
- ▶ Seeks to create an authorizing environment for decision-making that encourages positive deviance and experimentation (as opposed to designing projects and programs and then requiring agents to implement them exactly as designed)
- ▶ Embeds this experimentation in tight feedback loops that facilitate rapid experiential learning (as opposed to enduring long lag times in learning from ex post “evaluation”)
- ▶ Actively engages broad sets of agents to ensure that reforms are viable, legitimate, relevant, and supportable (as opposed to a narrow set of external experts promoting the top-down diffusion of innovation)

EFFECTS OF ICT ON PARTICIPATION?

A- PROCESS

- ▶ Operational (trivial effects)
 - ▶ Costs, efficiencies
- ▶ Citizens (demand side/voice)
 - ▶ Individuals: Rate, inclusiveness, agency
 - ▶ Groups: collective action, preference aggregation
- ▶ The State and Service Providers (supply)
 - ▶ Responsiveness, transparency, accountability
